THE GENEVA BRIDGE

Mutual recognition, a **shared** architecture.

A mechanism for the mutual recognition of conformity assessments of AI systems, grounded in the WTO TBT Agreement, Article 6.

RECOGNISE

The mechanism

The Geneva Bridge allows jurisdictions and sector associations to mutually recognise the conformity assessments of AI systems. It translates, it does not harmonise.

GROUNDING

Legal basis

WTO TBT Agreement, Article 6. No treaty renegotiation is required; national authorities retain full sovereignty.
